

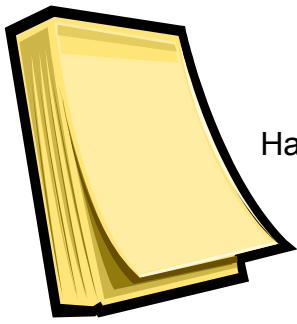

How to use a Language Log

ENTRY	TYPE OF ENTRY	PART of SPEECH	MEANING	USE: In a sentence or phrase
<i>The new word</i>	Vocabulary	Noun	Look-up the word in the dictionary	Write sentence with the word or phrase
Super	Vocabulary	Adjective	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• to be great</li><li>• larger than most</li><li>• very big</li></ul>	That was a super football game!
“Look-over”	Idiom or idiomatic expression	Verb + preposition		To read quickly

## WORDS TO GO

### Practice Dialogs

DIALOGUE PRACTICE

On the telephone

**ESOL Student:** “Hello, my name is \_\_\_\_\_. I am studying English at Seminole Community College in Sanford.
