CLASSROOM PROCEDURES:	<p>Have the students share some of the parenting practices they were exposed to as children and some of the practices they use today.</p> <p>Discuss any changes they feel they have made to better a situation or changes that were not good.</p> <p>Explain why children misbehave according to Dinkmeyer.</p> <p>List the four goals of misbehavior:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. attention 2. power 3. revenge 4. display their inadequacy <p>Instruct students to give examples of misbehavior and how they would respond to each in a constructive way.</p> <p>Have students explain their own feelings and reactions to the misbehavior</p> <p>Distribute activity sheet and discuss disciplining techniques, (Activity sheet : Goals of Misbehavior. Dinkmeyer)</p>	GRAMMATICAL FOCUS:	Write a paragraph illustrating one of the four goals of misbehavior and the positive response to that goal.
TEXT BOOKS:	Supplemental text: Systematic Training for Effective Parenting by Dinkmeyer,Dinkmeyer and MacKay	PRONUNCIATION:	Produce stress and intonation in phrases and sentences
